

Year C, Fourth Sunday in Lent, March 30, 2025 Joshua 5:9-12; Psalm 32

2 Corinthians 5:16-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32

Saints of God, here we are midway in our Lenten journey. What a wonderful thing to find that the Psalm for today celebrates forgiveness!

"Happy is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Happy is the one to whom the LORD imputes no iniquity and, in whose spirit, there is no deceit." Psalm 32:1-2

The verbs *is forgiven* and *is covered*, in Psalm 32:1 are both translated as present perfect passive participle. The word *IS* expresses the meaning of "always now," like "God is love," 1 John 4:8.

FORGIVEN and COVERED, in the perfect tense, means they are complete, with nothing to add or subtract, as James reminds us, "...so that you may be complete and whole, lacking in nothing." James 1:4b

As passive participles, *IS FORGIVE*N and *IS COVERED* describes the soul condition of the "happy one, mentioned in this glorious psalm as the receiver, rather than the doer. He or she obtains or accepts by or from someone other than themselves.

Imagine standing under a waterfall. You feel the cleansing, reviving power of water pouring over your only body because you are standing there. We are totally forgiven, **BY** God who forgives our transgressions. We are completely covered **BY** the God who protects our souls from guile. It is...pure gift!
